#### Message for primary school:

#### 61% of children brush better since their previous visit to the Poetsbus!

On 15 September, the Poetsbus, a converted American school bus, parked in front of the Wereldwijs primary school once again. During this visit, we saw 86% of the children in grades 2 to 8. These pupils were selected based on their Gewoon Gaaf score, which showed that they needed extra oral care (e.g. due to cavities or inflamed gums).

#### The results at a glance:

- 61% of the children brush better than during our first visit.
- 29% brush the same as before.
- 10% have healthy gums.
- 90% have (still) inflamed gums.
- 17% have their teeth brushed daily.
- 58% never have their teeth brushed.

#### What can we improve together?

In children up to the age of 11, fine motor skills are still developing. That is why it is important to brush their teeth daily until the age of 11 – ideally once a day. Are you unsure whether your child is brushing their teeth properly on their own? Use the plaque disclosing tablets we have provided to check this easily.

#### Would you like to receive a personal report?

All parents/guardians received a personal oral care report during the week of our visit. This was sent via secure healthcare email from dental hygienist Poetsbus Zorgmail. Please note: this email may sometimes end up in your spam folder. Didn't receive an email? Send a message to administratie@poetsbus.nl stating your child's name and date of birth.

#### Message for the Language classes:

#### The Wereldwijs Language School is on its way to healthy children's teeth!

In September, the Poetsbus visited the Wereldwijs Language School. We would like to summarise the most important findings:

- 58% of the children had cavities
- 93% had inflamed gums
- 100% require extra care according to the Gewoon Gaaf score
